



## 2025 British Junior Open Championships – Selection Criteria

The British Junior Open (BJO) is one of the most prestigious junior tournaments in the world and is an opportunity for top U.S. junior players to challenge themselves in a major international competition.

The BJO will be held at the beginning of January (2-6), 2025. England Squash generally allows US Squash to nominate five (5) players per age division to participate in the tournament.

Note that this trip is **self-funded** by the players.

*\*As of 5/15/2024, US Squash has not received final information from England Squash regarding the tournament structure, and entry process for the 2025 BJO. The selection criteria listed below are subject to change pending final information being provided by England Squash.*

### 1. Eligibility Criteria

In order to be considered for selection, all players must:

- Maintain full United States citizenship.
- Be age-eligible for the competition in question.
- Maintain US Squash membership from the start of the candidate process through the end of the competition.
- Have no documented serious on or off-court conduct violations of the US Squash Code of Conduct.
- Sign and comply with all US Squash U.S. Junior Team policies and contracts.

### 2. Selection Information

Players wishing to participate on the U.S. Team for the 2025 BJO will be selected based on the following criteria:

- The top three (3) players by US Squash rating per division who are age-eligible to compete in the BJO in the Boys' and Girls' U11, U13, U15, U17 and U19 age divisions, who confirm their interest, will be selected for the U.S. Team.
  - Ratings will be based on the player ratings as of the Wednesday (October 16, 2024) after the October JCT event: the Arlen Specter Pennsylvania Junior Championships (12-14 October)
  - Players do not need to have a current points-based ranking in the age division in which they will compete. However, in order to be eligible to be selected by rating, players must have completed a minimum of twelve (12) matches in accredited junior competition—recorded on their Club Locker profile—played within the 12 months before October 16, 2024 (from October 11, 2023, to October 12, 2024). Friendly matches do not apply towards this match count.
- The remaining two positions will be selected based on a combination of player rating and ranking as of the Wednesday after the October JCT event: the Arlen Specter Pennsylvania Junior



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Championships (12-14 October). Generally, this position will be offered to the next highest rated player. However the National Team Selection committee reserves the right to factor in ranking in making their decision.

- The National Team Selection committee will make the final decision regarding the selection of the players.
- All players must have passed their age-appropriate referee exam.
- Should any player(s) decline a position, the next highest-rated player(s) will be considered for selection.
- In the event that players are tied in rating, the rating will be taken to the next decimal point to break the tie, with the higher-rated player earning the team selection.

### 3. Seeding

Player seeding at the British Junior Open is determined by England Squash. PSA ranking, national ranking, and performance at past BJO competitions is generally used to guide their decisions. Seeding for the players representing the U.S. in the tournament will not therefore necessarily reflect the order in which players were selected.

There is one round of petitions for US Squash officials and the national coaching staff to submit petitions on behalf of the seeded players. Parents are encouraged to help in this process by submitting any relevant results within the past 2 years to the coaches for their players against international players seeded higher than them.

### 4. Replacement & Removal of Athletes

Following final selection of the Team members, replacements will only be made if any of the following apply:

- An athlete voluntarily withdraws due to injury or illness, certified by a physician.
- An athlete is injured but refuses verification of their fitness for competition by a physician; the injury may be assumed to be disabling and the player may be removed.
- A qualifying Team member voluntarily submits their resignation from competition in writing to the National Coach at [nationalteams@ussquash.org](mailto:nationalteams@ussquash.org).

Removal of Team members — players are expected to engage in all team preparatory activities and uphold a high level of conduct. Potential grounds for removal of a team member include but are not limited to:

- Violation of team rules.
- Violation of US Squash Code of Conduct.

### 5. International Disclaimer

These procedures are based on BJO and England Squash rules and regulations as presently known and understood. Any change in the selection procedures caused by a change in rules and regulations will be distributed to the affected athletes immediately. The selection criteria are based on the latest information available to the US Squash. However, the selection process is always subject to unforeseen intervening circumstances and realistically cannot account for every possible contingency.
